Treasurer's Report

Based on the Audited Financial Statements for the year ending March 31, 2022

At the end of the last fiscal year, March 31, 2021, Community Links had a Bank Balance of \$589,483 including \$128,710 in restricted funds in the Casino Bank Account.

The targeted Board approved budget amount of 3.7M was met, and we ended up with a net deficit amount of -\$57,186, after Year-End Adjustments for amortization and deferred contributions.

We, as the Board of Directors, are able to monitor the financial health of Community Links, through monthly reports from the Finance Manager. These reports include a measurement of Working Capital, which indicates whether a company has enough short-term assets to cover its short-term debt.

Anything below 1.0 indicates negative working capital and it is believed that a ratio between 1.2 and 2.0 is sufficient. Community Links Working Capital in the 21-22 fiscal year varied between a ratio of 1.94 and 13.83, averaging 3.91 over the full year.

Staffing costs remain our largest expenditure year to year.

Government Funding decreased slightly by 4.6% this fiscal year, primarily due to additional COVID supports that were received last fiscal and not this fiscal, but User Fees were up by 28% due to COVID restrictions being lifted and things getting back to normal for Family Day Homes and in person Counselling. For Day Homes, as of January 2022, the Government increased the Subsidy support available by lowering income thresholds for qualification as well as instituting the Affordability Grant for most children between the ages of 0 to Kindergarten. Combined, these supports are targeted to get childcare down to \$10/day within the next 5 years.

Our fund development goals were back on track this fiscal, with COVID restrictions being lifted and events resuming. Our donations and fundraising were up 81% compared with last year.


Overall, we were able to remain on Budget for most expense line items. The Auditors were satisfied that we met our obligations to funders in 21-22 and that it was another successful year financially.






